THE GATHERING

Please STAND as the President enters. The President greets the people:

My brothers and sisters, we gather for worship in the name of ▶ the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

The Lord be with you.

And with thy spirit.

The President introduces the Prayers of Penitence in either of these words:

The sacrifice of God is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart God will not despise. Let us come to the Lord, who is full of compassion, and acknowledge our transgressions in penitence and faith.

or

Compassion and forgiveness belong to the Lord our God, though we have rebelled against him.

Let us then renounce our wilfulness and ask his mercy by confessing our sins in penitence and faith.

SILENT PRAYER

Kyrie Eleison Lord, have mercy.

Almighty God,

our heavenly Father, we have sinned against thee and against our neighbour, in thought and word and deed, through negligence, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault.

We are heartily sorry and repent of all our sins.

For the sake of thy Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past, and grant that we may serve thee in newness of life to the glory of thy name. Amen.

The President pronounces God's Absolution:

The Lord enrich you with his grace, and nourish you with his blessing; the Lord defend you in trouble and keep you from all evil; the Lord accept your prayers, and absolve you

from your offences, for the sake of Jesus Christ, our Saviour.

Amen.

In silence, we pray.

Silent prayer; then the President prays the Collect. At the end, all reply:

Amen

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

Please SIT for a reading from the Old or New Testament follows.

At the end:

For the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

A Responsorial Psalm follows; after which, please STAND for the Gospel; which is heralded by all singing the Acclamation with the cantor:



Praise to you O Christ, king of e - ter - nal Glo - ry.

The cantor sings the verse and then we repeat the refrain:



Praise to you O Christ, king of e - ter - nal Glo - ry.

The Lord be with you.

And with thy spirit.

Hear to the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to N \blacksquare Glory be to thee, O Lord.

At the end

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to thee, O Christ.

The President introduces the Prayers of intercession, for which please sit or kneel:

Let us pray to the Lord, who guides us through the wilderness of temptation into our fellowship with him and with one another.

The following response may be used between each bidding:

Lord of compassion, in your mercy, hear us.

or

Lord, hear us. Lord, graciously hear us.

At the end

We gather up these and all of our prayers in the company of Blessed Mary, *NN* and all the saints.

Merciful Father, accept these prayers for the sake of thy Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

THE LITURGY OF THE SACRAMENT

Please STAND as the President introduces the Peace:

Since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us access to his grace. The peace of the Lord be always with you and also with you.

or, especially in Passiontide:

Once we were far off, but now in union with Christ Jesus we have been brought near through the shedding of Christ's blood, for he is our peace. The peace of the Lord be always with you. And also with you.

The altar is prepared and then the president takes the bread and the cup:

God of our journey, as we walk with you on your path of obedience, sustain us on our way and lead us to your glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

or, especially in Passiontide:

Jesus, true vine and bread of life, ever giving yourself that the world might live, let us share your death and passion: make us perfect in your love.

Amen.

The Lord be with you and with thy spirit.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up unto the Lord.

Let us give thanks unto the Lord our God. It is meet and right so to do.

The President continues the prayer, thanking God for all his saving works, and then invites the people to join their praises with the whole company of heaven:

..... for ever praising you and saying:

Holy, holy, Lord God of hosts, heaven and earth are full of thy glory. Glory be to thee, O Lord most high.

▼ Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The President continues the prayer, repeating the Lord's own words over the bread and wine and asks the Father to send the Spirit on them to sanctify them.

Then:

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

The President continues, joining our offering with Christ's sacrifice of himself. At the end:

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.

Amen

Silent Prayer

Lord Jesus, remember us in your kingdom, and teach us to pray:

Our Father,
who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come;
thy will be done;
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
the power and the glory,
for ever and ever.
Amen.

The president breaks the consecrated bread for all to share:

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body for we all share in one bread.

We say Agnus Dei:

Jesus Lamb of God, have mercy on us. Jesus, bearer of our sins, have mercy on us. Jesus, redeemer of the world, grant us peace.

The president invites all to receive Holy Communion:

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldest come under my roof, but speak the word only and my soul shall be healed.

Baptised persons who are communicant members of Churches which subscribe to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity, and who are in good standing in their own church, may receive Holy Communion at this service.

All taking part online are encouraged to make their Spiritual Communion, using the following prayer:

Lord Jesus Christ, grant, that as the hem of your garment, touched in faith, healed the woman who could not touch your body, so the soul of your servant may be healed by faith in you, whom I cannot now sacramentally receive; through your tender mercy, who lives and reigns with the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit ever one God, world without end.

Amen.

THE DISMISSAL

The President prays the Post Communion prayer, then:

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

The President uses a seasonal introduction to the Blessing, then:

...... And the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always. **Amen.**

The Mass is ended; go in the peace of Christ. **Thanks be to God**
